- Barton is proposing a new hospital on the Nevada side due to California seismic retrofit requirements by 2030.
- The existing California campus is aging and cannot meet updated structural codes.
- Barton emphasizes they are not leaving California; outpatient and wellness services will remain and expand.
- New Nevada campus would host:
 - Inpatient hospital
 - Emergency care
 - Oncology and cardiovascular services
 - Current plan includes:
 - o 55 inpatient beds
 - 3–5 story building (max height proposed: 80 feet)
- Environmental review and TRPA compliance in progress.
- Construction targeted by 2035, pending approvals and community input.
- Discussion on EMS impacts, traffic during July 4th, and community demographics shifting older, requiring enhanced care services.
